







## Rail expansion. Dock improvements. More ship calls.

A dramatic increase in ship calls at the Port of Greater Baton Rouge prompted improvements to deepwater cargo docks on the Mississippi River and an expansion of rail infrastructure.

Union Pacific Railroad has expanded its interchange tracks along
Louisiana Hwy. 1 to be accessed from either the north or south in a \$12 million
upgrade, and the Port is moving forward with a \$25 million chambering yard
south of the Intracoastal Waterway. The state's Capital Outlay Program will help
fund the construction of the chambering yard's three, 110-car tracks to handle
Drax Biomass wood pellet trains. In addition, Louis Dreyfus Commodities will
complete their \$20 million facility rail tracks this year to handle 110-car grain trains.

To meet the needs of Drax Biomass, Louis Dreyfus Commodities, **Genesis Energy**, and **Contanda Terminals**, the Port has improved 3,500 feet of deepwater cargo docks with a new fendering system and larger, stronger mooring hooks.

**Port Executive Director Jay Hardman** reports, "We're busy, so as soon as we finish one improvement, we're already making plans to expand for future needs."
